Admission Requirements:

<u>Notice</u>: Admission requirements and procedures may change without prior notice. Please check with Health Sciences Division and/or website for updates.

In addition to the general admission requirements of the College, application to the ADN Mobility Program requires **ALL** of the following:

- 1. Non-nursing applicants to have an AAS degree and current licensure/certification as a Paramedic, Medical Assistant Technologist, Physical Therapist Assistant, Radiologic Technologist, Surgical Technologist and for Practical Nurses to have a certificate and current unencumbered or non-restricted license as a Practical Nurse in Alabama.
- 2. One year of full time work experience with direct patient care in field of study documented on company letterhead and signed by HR or employment administrator.
- 3. Proof of a CNA course completion for non-nursing applicants (certification not required).
- Unconditional admission to SUSCC.
- 5. Cumulative 2.5 grade point average (GPA) calculated on nursing required academic core courses.
- 6. Minimum 2.0 GPA at Southern Union if previously enrolled. Transfer students must enter the College on clear status.
- 7. Official transcripts in the Records Office from **ALL** post-secondary institutions attended, along with high school transcript.
- 8. Official score from ACT National or ACT Residual with a minimum composite score of 18. (No time limit on when the test was taken.)
- 9. Completion of prerequisite general education courses with a minimum grade of "C". See listing under Curriculum.
- 10. Submission of completed application for the ADN Mobility option before the published deadline.

Meeting minimal requirements does not guarantee acceptance.

Admission to the Nursing Program is competitive and the number of students admitted is limited by the number of clinical facilities available. After meeting minimal requirements, applicants are rank-ordered for acceptance using a points system based on score from ACT National or Residual and quality points from selected college courses. Students may be eligible to earn additional points (max. 10 pts.) See program application for details.
