

PHYSICAL THERAPIST ASSISTANT

OVERVIEW

The Physical Therapist Assistant (PTA) is a technically-educated, licensed health care provider who works under the supervision of a licensed physical therapist (PT). The PTA performs duties and carries out treatment plans as directed by the PT. Duties of the PTA are varied and include, but are not limited to the application of physical modalities, exercise programs, gait training, functional activities, and patient education. Physical requirements for PTAs utilize various rehabilitative techniques to help patients whose abilities have been impaired by an accident, injury, illness, disease or other health-related conditions that limit movement and functional abilities. Clients include adult and pediatric patients with orthopedic and neurologic injuries and various medical conditions. Employment settings include acute care and rehabilitation hospitals, outpatient clinics, schools, nursing homes, home health, sports medicine clinics, and even academic institutions.

LENGTH OF PROGRAM

3 Semesters (67 semester hours of which 29 semester hours of prerequisite course work are required for admission).

CREDENTIALS EARNED

Students who graduate in the Physical Therapist Assistant Program will be eligible to sit for the national licensure exam. Graduation from a physical therapist assistant education program accredited by the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE), 3030 Potomac Ave, Suite 100, Alexandria, VA, 22305-3085; phone; 703-706-3245; accreditation@apta.org is necessary for eligibility to sit for the licensure examination, which is required in all states.

APPLICATION DATES:

Valley Campus classes are admitted once per year (spring semester). Application window is January through September only. An email indicating acceptance or denial will be sent to your SUSCC email account after 6 weeks from the application deadline.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

In addition to the general admission requirements of the College, application to the Physical Therapist Assistant Program requires:

1. Minimum 10 hrs of PT Observation experience with signed documentation from licensed PT/PTA.
2. Completion of prerequisite academic core courses with a minimum grade of "C" or higher meeting a 2.5 cumulative GPA.
3. Minimum 2.0 gpa at Southern Union if previously enrolled. Transfer students must enter the College on clear status.
4. Official transcripts in Records Office from all postsecondary institutions attended and high school transcript.
5. Official score on ACT National or ACT Residual with a minimum composite score of 18. (No superscores. No time limit on when the test was taken.) Will accept a bachelor's degree or higher from an accredited institution which will be equivalent to 18 points.
6. Submission of application for Physical Therapist Assistant Program.

Meeting minimal requirements does not guarantee acceptance.

Admission to the Physical Therapist Assistant program is competitive, and the number of students admitted is limited by the number of clinical facilities available. After meeting minimal requirements, applicants are rankordered for acceptance using a points system based on score on ACT/ACT Residual and quality points from selected college courses. Students may be eligible to earn additional points.
