Admission Requirements:
Notice: Admission requirements and procedures may change without prior notice. Please check with Health Sciences Division and/or website for updates.

- In addition** to the general admission requirements of the College, application to the LPN to Associate Degree Nursing Program Track II requires **ALL** of the following:
1. An unencumbered or non-restricted license to work as a Practical Nurse in Alabama.
 2. Completion of the standardized statewide practical nursing curriculum from a college inside the Alabama College System within 1 year of application to program.
 3. Unconditional admission to SUSCC.
 4. Cumulative 2.5 grade point average (GPA) calculated on nursing required academic core courses.
 5. Minimum 2.0 GPA at Southern Union if previously enrolled. Transfer students must enter the College on clear status.
 6. Official transcripts in the Records office from **ALL** post-secondary institutions attended, along with high school transcript.
 7. Official score from ACT National or ACT Residual with a minimum composite score of 18. (No time limit on when the test was taken.)
 8. Completion of prerequisite general education courses with a minimum grade of "C". See listing under Curriculum.
 9. Submission of completed application for the LPN to ADN Mobility option before deadline.

Meeting minimal requirements does not guarantee acceptance.
Admission to the Nursing Program is competitive, and the number of students admitted is limited by the number of clinical facilities available. After meeting minimal requirements, applicants are rank-ordered for acceptance using a points system based from score from ACT National or Residual and quality points from selected college courses. Students may be eligible to earn additional points (max. 10 pts.) See program application for details.
