OVERVIEW

Surgical Technologists are vital members of the surgical team. The CST works closely with surgeons, RNs, anesthesia care providers and other members of the surgical team. Duties include set-up, preparation and participation in surgical procedures. The CST requires knowledge of instrumentation, equipment, sterilization and safety practices, and the ability to anticipate the needs of the surgical team.

Three semesters (60-69 hours of which 18 hours of prerequisite course work are required for admission)

Surgical Technologists are employed by hospitals, physicians' offices, and outpatient surgical clinics.

ADMISSION

Opelika Campus

Classes are admitted once per year. Priority admission begins March 1st and applications are accepted until class is filled.

Admission to the Surgical Technology Program is competitive and the number of students admitted is limited by the number of faculty and clinical facilities available.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

In addition to the general admission requirements of the College, application to the Surgical Technology program requires:

1. Unconditional admission to the College;
2. 2.5 grade point average (GPA) calculated on completed academic core courses and;
3. 2.0 GPA at Southern Union if previously enrolled. Transfer students must enter the College on clear academic status (2.0 GPA);
4. Official transcripts from all postsecondary institutions attended. Beginning Fall 2014, all new and transfer students must submit high school or GED transcripts;
5. Submission of complete application packet for Surgical Technology Program.
